### **INCLEMENT WEATHER**

Remember to listen to WHBL (AM1330) or WTMJ (620 AM) when you suspect that bad weather is on its way or has arrived. If you are a TV person, turn to the major network stations (4, 6, 12, 58) to view announcements. If an announcement talks about or shows RANDOM LAKE SCHOOL DISTRICT, that includes us. Whatever Random Lake does, we have to follow because we are dependent on the public bus service. Decisions can range from no school, to late start, to early dismissal. Also remember, that when we have a LATE START, preschool classes will not be held. Finally, use your own good judgment as to whether or not your child will attend school on a bad weather day. The conditions at your home could be quite different than here and visa versa.
